You must be 16 or over to apply for a position at Cohuna Amcal Pharmacy and it is recommended that you have a bubbly personality and be interested in health care. Jess would like genuine enthusiasm to be demonstrated in at least one area of the business, stating that she would “love people to be excited about wound care”. You do not need to have prior work experience to apply for a job at Cohuna Amcal, personal referees can be provided. You do need to show that you are you prepared to work hard and willing to learn. Also, do not turn up for an interview in ripped jeans etc. Although it may not reflect your ability to do a job, your appearance will be taken into consideration.

If you are still at school you will be expected to work three hour shifts after school, potentially on weekends and during school term holidays. There will be a 3 month trial period if successful in your application and study will play a part of your role as you learn about the different medications that you will be selling.

### **What are your tips to young people looking for work?**

Know that you will not always be in the 'pretty parts' of the pharmacy – you will not be able to simply hand ball a customer onto someone else if they don't want to look at the cosmetics etc.

Be professional - "leave it at the door and pick it up on the way home" Jess advises. Don't bring your personal life to work.

Be early and don't run out the door. Arrive before your shift starts so you have a chance to freshen up before you officially start and wait until all of the duties of the day have been completed properly before leaving at the end.

Put yourself out there; go above and beyond!
